THE WAY WE DO THE THINGS WE DO (and why)

Presiding Bishop Michael Curry likes to say that we are the Episcopal Branch of the Jesus Movement. Absolutely! Yet we are also unique. If you speak about our beliefs or the way we practice our faith to anyone unfamiliar with our particular form of Christianity, you're likely to receive a puzzled look or a blank stare. And often we're unable to explain because it's been a long time since we attended confirmation classes and we haven't taken a refresher course, or maybe because we never knew in the first place.

Take our liturgy, for example. Many of us are Episcopalians because we love the liturgy. It's one of the things that makes us different from other protestant denominations. Its words and movements offer us comfort and security, the "sameness" we rarely find in the world outside the church. It also gives us stability. We're pretty much assured that we can find something familiar in the worship of any Episcopal church, no matter where it is, and that's a blessing we cherish. Every part of our liturgy has a purpose, but because it's repetitive from week to week it can also become so routine that we no longer pay attention to its purpose and meaning. Whether we've been Episcopalians all our lives or have come to The Episcopal Church more recently, remembering "why" can give us new insights about our faith.

Beginning next week and in the coming weeks, I'll be using this space for "Episcopal Explanations," exploring different aspects of our unique practice of faith—what we do and what we believe and why.
